Borage:

Decorative borage has bright blue star-like flowers each with a cone of prominent black anthers, often described as a “beauty spot”. Occasionally, a plant may have pink or more rarely white flowers. The stems, leaves and flower buds are all covered with silvery hairs which catch the light and give the whole plant a rough feel.

This annual has oval leaves on hairy stems which are both cucumber scented when crushed.



The flowers can be used to decorate salads and cakes. For a very attractive addition to summer drinks, carefully place the flowers in ice cube compartments, slowly pour water over them and freeze.

Borage makes an excellent facial steam for improving dry sensitive skin. Dry the flowers of borage face down on paper to add some extra color to a potpourri mixture.

Apple Crisp

6 medium sized apples, sliced
 $\frac{3}{4}$ cup brown sugar
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup flour
 $\frac{3}{4}$ cup rolled oats (quick)
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup oleo
1 tsp cinnamon
1 tsp. vanilla
 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt

Put apples in buttered 8x8pan. Mix sugar, flour, rolled oats, salt, cinnamon and oleo until crumbly. Spread over apples and bake uncovered for 35 minutes at 350 degrees. Serve whipped cream on top or a scoop of ice cream if desired. Good served warm or cold.

A 1990 study by Strayhorn, Weidman and Larson followed 201 parents of children in Head Start. Parents were measured on a variety of behaviors related to interacting with their children. The results showed that parents who rated high on church attendance and related activities exhibited more positive parenting skills than non-religious parents.
